

Tier 1:

- Reading Workshop in every classroom
 - students engaged in reading and writing
- Targeted guided reading instruction to accelerate student achievement
- Monitor student achievement through running records, F&P Benchmark Assessments, and AIMSweb assessments
- Put into practice common literacy language



ACTION PLan



"Grow, Learn, PLay"

Tier 2:

- Information from assessments is used to target instruction to students' area of need.
- Students with greater needs receive targeted guided reading instruction every day.
- Reading and ENL services are scheduled outside the literacy instruction time.





ACTION PLan



"Grow, Learn, PLay"

Tier 3:

- Provide a second opportunity for direct instruction in a small group daily
- Kindergarten
 - Add reading teacher services
 - Intensive letter and sound work
- First Grade
 - Administer in-depth diagnostic assessments to hone in on specific skills for individual students


