

Role of the School Counselor

Student Expectations

- ★ Students must be in the building by 8:15am to ensure they arrive to 1st period on time
- ★ Arrive to each class on time
- ★ Students have 3 minutes between each bell to get to class
- ★ Hall sweeps are conducted randomly throughout the week
- ★ Every student received 1 warning each week
- ★ After 1st warning 1 hour of detention per lateness

Non- emergency out of town trips should be scheduled when school is not in session.

For the month of June- regents exams are scheduled in the weeks following the last day of classes. Students are expected to be present for their corresponding exams.


What is a Regents Exam?

- ★ In New York State, Regents Examinations are statewide standardized tests in core high school subjects required for a Regents Diploma to graduate. (You cannot opt out)
- ★ Must pass a minimum of 5 Regents Examinations to graduate from High School.
- ★ Must pass a minimum of 9 Regents Examinations to graduate from High School with an Advanced Regents Diploma.

Before entering the 10th grade, you must earn a minimum of <u>5.5 credits</u>.



Before entering the 11th grade, you must earn a minimum of 11.0 credits.



Before entering the 12th grade, you must earn a minimum of 16 credits.
