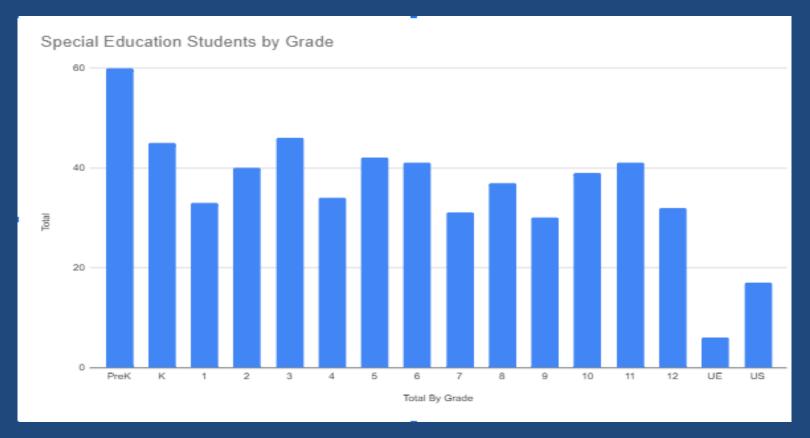

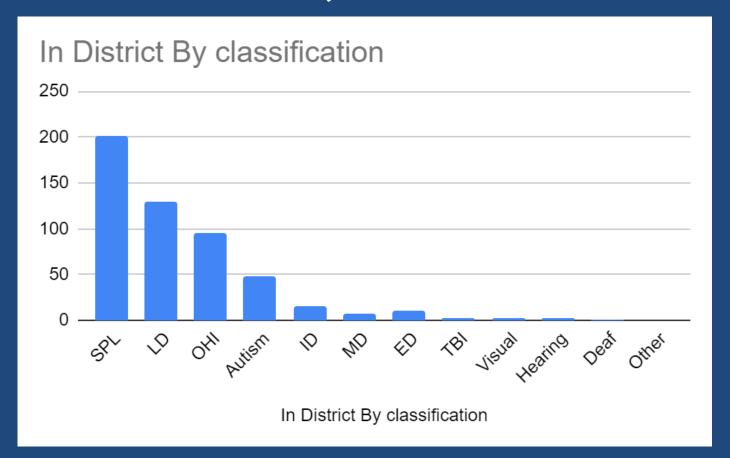

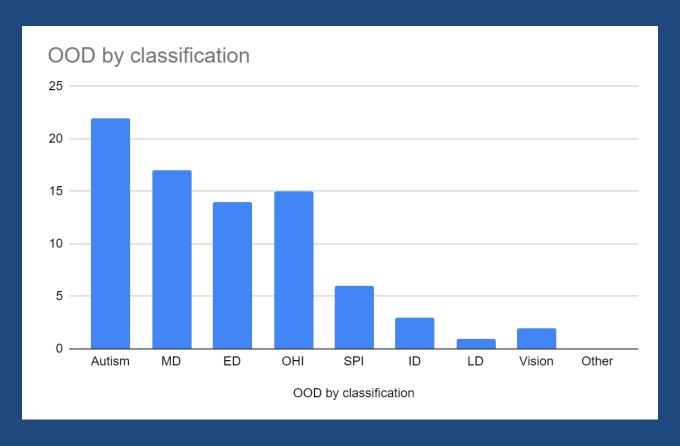
Special Education Students by Grade Level



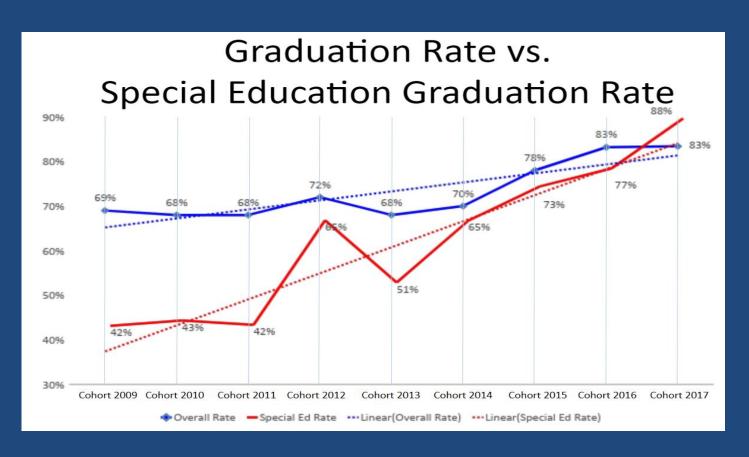
In-District By Classification

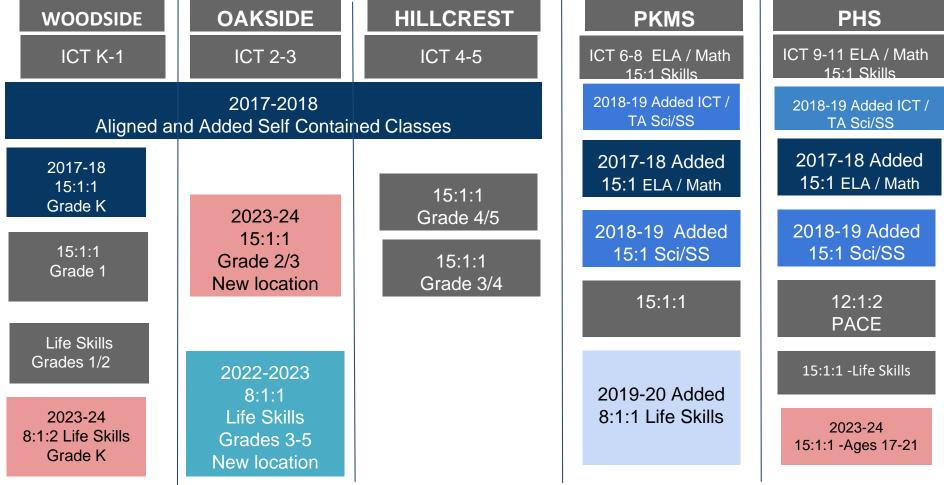

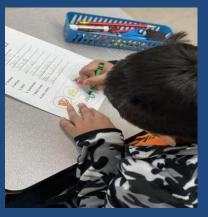
2023-2024 Budget Summary

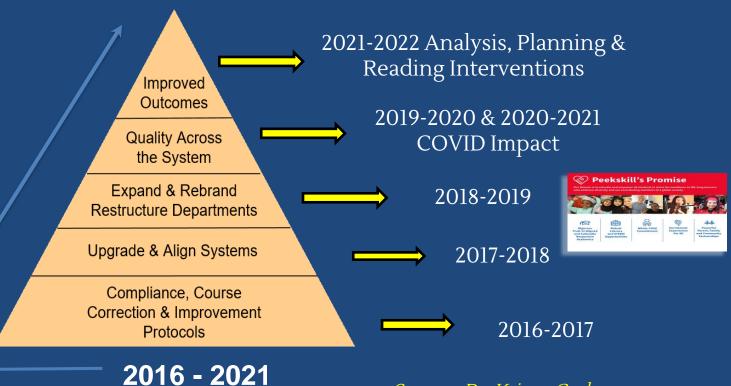
